RULES AND REGULATIONS

AS STATED BY THE KESWICK ANGLERS ASSOSIATION

- 1. This permit only allows for fishing from Low Briery Holiday park. It does NOT permit for fishing anywhere outside those boundaries. Should you wish to fish elsewhere, you will be required to purchase a permit from the Keswick Anglers Association.
- 2. Juniors (Under 12) should be accompanied by an adult.
- 2.1. You must carry proof or purchase when fishing
- 3. Preservation of Fish Stocks
- 3.1. On behalf of the KAA: We are committed to preserving fish stocks for generations to come. From the start of the 2024 season the river Greta is catch and release for all species. All species must be handled with consideration to its survival.
- 3.2. Live baiting is strictly prohibited on the River Greta
- 4. Trout Fishing
- 4.1. For all rivers The fishing method is restricted to fly only with barbless or de-barbed hooks at all times. KAA officers may inspect to ensure hooks used are barbless or de-barbed at any time.
- 5. Salmon Fishing
- 5.1. Fly fishing allowed at all times. Spinning, prawn and shrimp fishing are allowed when river height and colour is suitable. Worming is not allowed as per 2024 Environment Agency byelaw changes.
- 5.2. All fishing for salmon is to be with barbless or de-barbed hooks.
- 6. Coarse Fishing.
- 6.1. For all rivers the fishing shall be restricted to fly only with barbless or de-barbed hooks at all times.
- 6.2. All coarse fish are to be returned to the water with careful handling.
- 7. General Rules
- 7.1. Anglers must avoid damaging fences and crops or unnecessarily disturbing animals or other guests on the park.
- 7.2. No litter to be left
- 7.3. Strictly no fires
- 7.4. Anglers must carry a suitable method of unhooking fish and attempt to minimize damage to fish while removing hooks.
- 8. Fishing Etiquette
- 8.1 Anglers, when fishing downstream, must commence fishing from the head of a pool and must move down the pool if other anglers are waiting to move in behind. Be courteous.
